1. Pursuant to authority contained in letter, War Department, The Adjutant General's Office, Washington, 28 May 1943, file AG 322 (5-26-43) OB-I-AERPG-M, subject, "Constitution and Activation of Headquarters, Civil Air Patrol," the Headquarters, Civil Air Patrol, having been constituted, is activated effective 1 June 1943 at 500 5th Avenue, New York City, N. Y.
2. The physical transfer of these Headquarters from Washington, D. C. to New York City will be completed by 1 July 1943.
3. This unit will be organized in accordance with Manning Table 1-3008, 15 May 1943, with an authorized strength of twenty (20) officers and no enlisted men. Specific authorization of officer grades will be published in a separate communication by the Commanding General, Army Air Forces (Assistant Chief of Air Staff, Personnel).
4. This unit will be equipped in accordance with a special list of equipment to be processed by the Commanding General, Army Air Forces (Assistant Chief of Air Staff, Materiel, Maintenance and Distribution).
 - a. A special list of equipment will be prepared by this Headquarters and submitted to the Commanding General, Army Air Forces (Assistant Chief of Air Staff, Materiel, Maintenance and Distribution).
 - b. Equipment in the special list will be requisitioned in the usual manner and shipped to the unit at station of activation.
5. Technical Order OO-25-3 (which replaced Technical Order OO-25-3A on 19 April 1943) will be complied with.
