Subject: Donations of Flying Equipment and Funds for
Civil Air Patrol Activities


To: All Unit Commanders

1. Numerous inquiries have been received by this Headquarters with respect to units of Civil Air Patrol accepting from business men donations of flying equipment and funds for CAP activities.

2. National Headquarters feels that it would be proper to accept the use of flying equipment for CAP activities providing title thereto remains in the name of the donor. As for the donation of funds to be used in financing CAP activities, National Headquarters sees no objection to accepting such donations. It is felt very definitely, however, that it would not be proper or in keeping with the nature and purposes of CAP to solicit the public for contributions or subscriptions or to engage in dances, carnivals, circuses and other fund-raising projects or to put on money-raising campaigns.

3. In no case should donations of funds or the use of flying equipment be accepted which involve advertising or publicity for the donor.
