SUPPLY OF SIGNAL EQUIPMENT BY AIR SERVICE COMMAND

1. Reference is made to Army Air Forces Regulation 65-63, dated 10 Sept 43. Therein, the Air Service Command is charged with furnishing supply items and maintenance facilities to Civil Air Patrol airplanes which are on active duty serving the armed forces of the United States. That Regulation pertains to no other units or activities of Civil Air Patrol.

2. The provisions of the above Army Air Forces Regulation embrace communications equipment in accordance with a decision made by the Air Communications Equipment Officer. Therefore, any benefits extended by the subject regulation may be applied to communications equipment used on CAP airplanes.

3. It is emphasized that any CAP member applying for the facilities permitted by 65-63 must adhere strictly to its provisions. In connection with this, individuals under suitable active duty orders must present a certificate of necessity executed by the certifying officer of his unit whenever accomplishing a purchase in person.

4. Any authorized CAP member who makes a proper application for the service outlined above and is refused by the Air Service Command agency to whom the request is directed will notify the National Communications Officer in writing, stating all pertinent circumstances. Appropriate action will be taken by this Headquarters.
