## Wing Command

# Commander

## Henry Irizarry



Col Henry Irizarry is the commander of the Florida Wing. He provides leadership and oversight for all Civil Air Patrol units and operations within the State of Florida. He assumed command of the wing in March 2014.

He is a native of Mayaguez, Puerto Rico, who joined the Civil Air Patrol as a cadet serving from 1985 to 1991 with the Mayaguez Cadet Squadron, Puerto Rico Wing. As a cadet he achieved the rank of cadet Lieutenant Colonel and reached what today is referred to as the Ira Eaker Award. He participated in countless encampments, emergency services exercises and events to include the Southeast Region Search and Rescue Competition and culminated his cadet career by participating in the International Air Cadet Exchange to Sweden.

In 2004, he rejoined CAP after returning from serving overseas for over 10 years in Colombia, Switzerland, Haiti and Costa Rica.

Col Irizarry has served on the CAP National Headquarters Homeland Security Staff, and at the group and unit levels as a Commander, Deputy Commander, Professional Development Officer, and Aircraft Maintenance Officer. He has completed all five levels of the CAP senior member professional development program and is an active Incident Commander, mission pilot and CAP Cadet/Air Force ROTC orientation pilot with over 750 hours of flight time. Amongst his many contributions, Col Irizarry has co-authored the CAP Officer Basic Course, he has served as an instructor at the National Cadet Officer School and in 2013 participated as a senior escort with the International Air Cadet Exchange to Australia.

Col Irizarry holds master ratings in command and professional development, two senior ratings in cadet programs and flight operations and a technician rating in safety.

Col Irizarry served in the U.S. Marine Corps for five years and retired from the U.S Coast Guard as a Commissioned Officer with over 20 years of active military service. Upon retirement and before joining Metal Shark Aluminum Boats as the Director of International Sales and Support, Col Irizarry served in the federal civil service with the Department of the Army.

Col Irizarry holds a bachelor's degree from Excelsior College and a Master of Arts degree from American Military University. He has also completed Graduate Executive Leadership programs at Harvard University and Cornell University.

# Vice Commander

## Luis Garcia



Lt Col Luis Garcia is the Florida Wing chief of staff. The chief of staff is the commander's principal assistant for directing, coordinating, supervising, and training the staff, except in areas the commander reserves. Staff members inform the chief of staff of any recommendations or information they pass directly to the commander, and of instructions they receive directly from the commander.

He has been active in Civil Air Patrol for 20 years in operations and emergency services. Among his previous assignments are stints as deputy commander of a cadet squadron, at group level as cadet programs officer and transportation officer, and at wing level as the Standardization/Evaluation Officer, Director of Emergency Services and Director of Operations. Garcia has completed Level IV in professional development. He is currently serving as an officer in the US Army Reserve.

Garcia is an active CAP pilot and involved in emergency services. He holds ratings as an Incident Commander, SAR/DR Mission Pilot, Mission Observer, Check Pilot and Mission Check Pilot, Cadet and AFROTC orientation pilot, and liaison officer.

Lt Col Garcia's military awards and badges include, but not limited to, the Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal with oak leaf clusters, Operation Iraqi Freedom Campaign Medal, Parachutist, and Combat Action Badge. His CAP awards and badges include the Meritorious Service Award, Commander's Commendation Award, Lifesaving Award and Senior Pilot.

# Chief of Staff

## Sonia Soto-Granville



Lieutenant Colonel Sonia Soto-Granville currently serves as the Florida Wing Chief of Staff overseeing all Wing functional areas. Prior to this appointment, Lieutenant Colonel Soto-Granville served as Florida Wing's Chief of Staff - Programs and immediately prior to that she served as the Southeast Region Director of Professional Development, overseeing the training for the Senior Members of the regions 6 Wings.

Lieutenant Colonel Soto-Granville joined Civil Air Patrol on November 15th, 1996 in the Cabo Rojo High School Cadet Squadron, Group 5 Puerto Rico Wing, where she served as Aerospace Education and Testing Officer. In April 1998, she was assigned as the Squadron Commander of Sabana Grande Cadet Squadron, which had only 3 Cadets and within 16 months, brought the unit strength to 32 Cadets and 4 Seniors with steady attendance, and in so doing, received the 1999 Puerto Rico Wing Squadron of Merit Award.

Lieutenant Colonel Soto-Granville has pursued much of CAP's Aerospace Education Mission by attending the 1997 and 1998 National Congress on Aerospace Education (NCASE) Conferences. She participated in the 1998 NASA's Program for Teachers held at Oklahoma University, earning post graduate credits in Aerospace Education.

In March 1999, Lieutenant Colonel Soto-Granville organized, directed and instructed at a Rocketry Weekend along with 7 other instructors, 5 staff personnel and 139 participating Cadets. In August 1999, Colonel Soto-Granville was transferred to Group 5 Headquarters where she served as Deputy Group Commander, Public Affairs Officer, Recruiting Officer, Administrative and Personnel Officer until January 2001. She then returned to her original unit and served as Aerospace Education Officer, Administrative and Personnel Officer until December 2003.

In December 2003, Lieutenant Colonel Soto-Granville was transferred to Puerto Rico Wing Headquarters where she worked in various staff assignments as Director of Professional Development, Director of Personnel, Personnel Officer Assistant and Wing Testing Officer for two Wing Commanders. In addition, Colonel Soto-Granville held the position of Director and was a staff member of numerous Squadron Leadership Schools and Corporate Learning Courses. She served as the Director of the 2006 & 2008 Southeast Region Staff College and was an instructor as well. She holds 3 Masters Ratings in Level 2 Specialty Areas of Aerospace, Professional Development and Personnel.

She is a 2006 National Staff College graduate and has also completed numerous CAP education and training courses. Lieutenant Colonel Soto-Granville was born in New York and earned a BA degree with specialization in Literature. She is also a licensed Radio Broadcaster. In her civilian life, she is an English Teacher. She is married to Austyn Granville, Jr., who is a Colonel in the Civil Air Patrol. She has three children: Alexis, who is a Major in CAP, and twins Julian, a Staff Sergeant and Ranger in the US Army, and his sister Juliana. Both her oldest son and daughter are former CAP Cadets.

- Wing Conference—Two AE sessions conducted by Wing staff.
- Advanced Rocketry Program—Florida Wing contributed to the authorship and implementation of this national program.
- STEM Kit Program—Florida Wing contributed to the organization of the rocketry portion of CAP's STEM Kit program.
- Yeager Awards—I do not have access to the actual numbers, but numerous members of Florida Wing earned Yeager Awards in 2014. This award is also now required for members to complete Level III of the Professional Development program.

## Mission Areas - Cadet Programs

**Change in Cadet Programs Leadership:** In April of 2014, Lt Col Justin McElvaney stepped down as the Director of Cadet Programs and Lt Col Pedro Santiago was appointed as the Director of Cadet Programs for Florida Wing.

**2013-2014 Winter Encampment:** This year's Winter Encampment had to be cancelled due to unforeseen scheduling conflicts at Tyndall AFB.

**Special Activities Selection Board:** In mid-January cadets from across the wing converged on Patrick AFB to participate in the annual Special Activities Selection Board. Cadets in attendance take written exams, drill exams, fitness test, and interview before a panel for their respective phases' cadet of the year award. All cadets who participated received a "green-light" status for NCSA rankings.

**Cadet Conference:** The Florida Wing Cadet Advisory Council hosted the Cadet Conference concurrent with the annual wing conference in Orlando, Florida. The cadet conference provided 16 seminars for cadets to attend and varied from open floor discussions with the CAC to Myths and Legends Debunked. The opportunity for cadets to network and meet others from around the wing was embraced by all the event was successful.

**International Air Cadet Exchange:** Florida Wing participated in the IACE program by hosting cadets from around the world.

**Summer Encampment:** The Summer Encampment was held at Camp Blanding, outside Starke, FL. Over 300 CAP personnel were on site for the basic contingent and advanced training squadron. The event conducted standard cadet encampment training and showcased Army and Air Force National Guard equipment, careers, and capabilities.

**Florida Leadership Academy:** The revamped Florida Leadership Academy was held in Orlando in October with the first of the four courses that will eventually make up the complete academy. All instruction at FLA is provided by Phase IV cadets or experienced, master rated, senior cadet programs officers. The cadets participating learned both unit level and wing encampment fundamentals and reinforced key objectives from the Learn to Lead textbook series.

EGLIN AFB, FL – FEBRUARY 2014 – Cadet Eagles and Senior Members of Eglin Composite Squadron FL423 conduct training and assessments to recognize the required Civil Air Patrol Annual Squadron Safety Day. The squadron commander Major Pam Becker kicked off the safety training session with reminding all the cadets and senior members present that ‘safety’ begins with each individual. Compliance is not an option and all personnel should be looking out at all times for unsafe practices. Squadron cadets then toured the 96<sup>th</sup> Weather Flight located in Base Operations. Air Force Staff Sergeant Michael Theos and Senior Airman Andrew Kirk conducted the weather operations briefing. The team explained how weather forecasts and mission execution forecasts were vital in air operations, pilots, aircrews, and ground crews conducting their missions for the United States Air Force and all Eglin AFB units. The weather forecasts are utilized for a myriad of missions conducted at Eglin AFB from dropping bomb ordinance to support of the ranges which include the Eglin water range, land range and support ranges that are used for parachute jumpers like the Rangers. Of special interest was to learn that the weather forecasts and weather condition play such an important role in the new F-35 training and test missions. Cadets also conducted a safety assessment of the squadron facility to include electrical, chemical, and possible safety hazards in and around the building. A part of the team conducted a safety inspection of the squadron airplane for compliance of required gear and documents need on-board the aircraft.

# Search for Missing Aircraft.

**STUART, Fla.** – After nearly four days of searching, the Florida Wing of the Civil Air Patrol has continued a vigilant search for missing pilot Andrei Postelnicu and his plane.

On Tuesday, CAP aircrews performed an intensive search of a section of the Atlantic Ocean offshore of Nettles Island, Florida.

Analysis of wind and tidal patterns since Friday have helped to determine the search areas deemed mostly likely to find both the pilot and the aircraft.

On Wednesday, aircrews will continue to search more targeted areas in the hopes that Postelnicu and his plane can be located. However, adverse weather may impact the effectiveness of the search.

“The ideal conditions for a search of this type are overhead sun and calm seas,” said Lt. Col. George Schaefer, Civil Air Patrol Incident Commander. “It appears, however, that the weather may not cooperate tomorrow.”

The aircraft departed Florida Keys Marathon Airport on Friday evening, bound for Vero Beach Municipal Airport. After the aircraft was reported overdue, the U.S. Air Force Rescue Coordination Center notified Civil Air Patrol to begin a search.

A Personal Locator Beacon that had activated near the search area on Monday ceased transmitting on Tuesday. It is not known if Mr. Postelnicu carried such a device, and it is being treated as an unrelated incident. No signal has yet been received from the Emergency Locator Transmitter, a similar, aircraft-mounted emergency beacon, that was known to be installed in the aircraft.

# Search for Missing Aircraft Continues

**STUART, Fla.** – Three days after Andrei Postelnicu and the single-engine aircraft he was piloting disappeared off of Florida’s Atlantic coast, the Civil Air Patrol’s Florida Wing continues to search for him.

Air and ground crews of the Florida Wing of Civil Air Patrol, in conjunction with the U.S. Coast Guard and the Martin County and St. Lucie County sheriff’s offices, searched over 30 miles of coastline on Monday, from North Hutchinson Island to Hobe Sound.

Air searches on Monday were focused on the possibility that the aircraft crashed in the Atlantic Ocean or was ditched offshore. A fisherman discovered a small piece of debris near Nettles Island that appeared to have come from the aircraft. It has been turned over to the National Transportation Safety Board for analysis.

“We are continuing our search and are hopeful that we will locate both Mr. Postelnicu and his aircraft as soon as possible.” said Lt. Col. George Shaefer, Civil Air Patrol Incident Commander. “Our personnel train constantly for searches of this nature and are giving their all to try to locate him.” Florida Wing plans to continue search operations on Tuesday.

The aircraft departed Florida Keys Marathon Airport on Friday evening, bound for Vero Beach Municipal Airport. After the aircraft was reported overdue, the U.S. Air Force Rescue Coordination Center notified Civil Air Patrol to begin a search.

On Monday, satellites detected an emergency signal from a Personal Locator Beacon near the search area, and the AFRCC directed Civil Air Patrol to locate it. However, the search aircraft was unable to detect the signal. It is not known if Mr. Postelnicu carried such a device. No signal has yet been received from the Emergency Locator Transmitter, a similar, aircraft-mounted emergency beacon, that was known to be installed in the aircraft.

All the teams in the Cyber Patriot program are graded and receive scores based on the number of successful protections against attacks. At the end of evening, which lasted into the late night hours, cadets had successfully protected the respective systems in the Florida state competition. # Who is Florida Wing's new commander Col Irizarry?

*Vision, Passion, Respect, Goals, Morale, Transparency, Accountability, Motivated, Ebullient, Pragmatic, Direct, Friendly, Candid, Responsive, Prepared, Communicative, Warm...*all words that describe Florida Wing's young and dynamic commander Col Henry Irizarry.

Col Irizarry spoke to a packed audience of over 50 seniors and cadets from around Group 3 for almost 2 hours to share his vision about Florida Wing's future, to take questions and engage the participants, and to address their issues and concerns.

The Group 3 Town Hall meeting and Commander's Call was hosted by the Commander for FL 466, South Lakeland Composite Squadron, 1st Lt Brett Kibbey, as planned, organized and supported by Maj Jennifer Richards, FL 466 Personnel, Professional Development, and Finance Officer, and Maj Jim Peto, Group 3 Deputy Commander.

Hot coffee, juices, fresh fruit, and pastries greeted the participants, arriving early from around Group 3, which encompasses a large geographical territory on Florida Wing's west coast.

Col Irizarry, when asked why he is conducting these town hall meetings with all the groups in the Florida Wing in his first 6 months of tenure as Wing Commander, he stressed that "it is important to open the lines of communication...to hear the concerns...to connect...and to make every effort to fix the problems. I have been asked tough questions...and I am trying to find answers...to have an open door policy."

He stated that being responsive in a timely manner was one of the biggest concerns raised around the Wing. He has made it his policy to respond in 48 hours or less...and to contact the Wing's Legal and Finance officer, if needed on an issue, in less than 24 hours. Quick indeed. He maintains a computerized

calendar and tickler file to aide him in accomplishing this goal.

Col Irizarry also stressed that he wants seniors and cadets to feel confident in his decision-making, that it is supported by evidence and facts, and is not ad hoc or based on whim or favoritism.

Group 3 Deputy Commander Maj Peto opened the Town Hall, followed by the FL 466 Color Guard, and the Invocation presented by Chaplain Robert Atchley.

Maj Lampasona, Group 3 Commander, made some brief remarks, and then introduced Col Irizarry.

Setting the tone for the day, Col Irizarry opened with his “mandated” statement on Respect, one of the guiding principles he has instituted around the Wing.

He briefly presented his own biography, so the audience would understand his background, and how it helped him shape his vision for Florida Wing’s future. He was a former cadet, starting in 1985, having achieved one of the highest honors for cadets, the Eaker award. Col Irizarry also spent 21 years active duty in the military, serving as a unit commander during his military tenure.

His philosophy on leadership is simple...”get out, meet people, let people know what you think, get feedback, act.” He emphatically stated, “how can I fix things, unless I know what is wrong.” He went on to state that, along with the 3 Civil Air Patrol missions, he wants to reinvigorate the areas of Professional Development and the all important mission of Safety.

Issues that he touched on that he would like to accomplish during his tenure include reimbursement for travel associated with SUIs; establishing Florida Wing’s own NESAs, with the first Emergency Services Academy set for December 2014 at Avon Park, focusing on ground teams, which will be followed by a mission base and aircrew Emergency Services Academy in June 2015. Safety workshops will be conducted around the Wing by the Wing Safety Officer. There will also be regularly scheduled Professional Development courses, with one having just been held over Labor Day weekend at Patrick Air Force base in Cocoa Beach.

Col Irizarry stressed that any activity or event should be meaningful to the members, and have a relevant purpose. Accordingly, he mentioned that the Professional Development Capstone courses are being tweaked to better serve the members. He also outlined his vision for needed training being offered in connection with the upcoming Florida Wing conference scheduled for May 2015, including pre-conference courses such as ICS 300 and 400, the SAR course, and other often requested courses involving in depth training and skill proficiency.

He also relayed that the Wing website is undergoing some much needed updates to make it more user friendly. He talked at length about Wing funding and finances, and discussed funding for certain aircrew proficiencies.

Col Irizarry urged that “undocumented requirements and policies hurt the membership. People need to know what is expected...they can’t guess...so if it is a policy, it needs to be in writing. We can’t make it up as we go.”

Taking care of our resources was another theme urged by the Wing Commander, as “these are not readily replaceable: radios, vans, computer, aircraft. And if you don’t use it, you lose it!” He went on to discuss the policy of assessing members or units for damaged or lost equipment and the appeals process.

Col Irizarry emphasized, “We are one team! Let’s break down the barriers and work together.”

In closing, before taking questions, he wanted the members to know that “morale is very important to me. The morale of the unit is a direct reflection on the commander. And I want to boost the morale of the CAP corps of the Wing.”

An extensive question and answer session followed, covering a myriad of topics by the senior and cadet participants in the room.

Col Irizarry, a passionate, fair-minded leader with a comprehensive vision for Florida Wing’s future, a bright future under his able leadership.
