



According to Encampment Mess Officer CWO Doran, this is probably the only Encampment where KP doesn't seem to be a punishment, because of the cooperation of the base personnel.



The instructor was giving a lecture on parachute jumping and concluded: "And if it doesn't open up, men, that's what is known as jumping to a conclusion".



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
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## HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU
