REPORT ON SPECIAL EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES

1. This Headquarters requires immediate information relative to certain items of equipment and supplies, expendible and non-expendible, which have been issued to CAP Coastal Patrols, as follows:

a. Items on which information is required:

- (1) Pneumatic Life Vests.
- (2) Carbon Dioxide Cylinders for Life Vests.
- (3) Pneumatic Life Rafts.
- (4) Signal Corps Crystals for Ground Radio Stations.
- (5) Smoke Bombs, (Signal Drifts)
- (6) Aluminum Powder.
- (7) Liquid Markers. (gallon bottles)
- (8) Other equipment, such as automobiles, trucks, "jeeps" etc.

b. Information required on each item:

- (1) Quantity.
- (2) Where obtained.
- (3) By whom obtained. (i. e. Major Noland, Captain Sterne)
- (4) Furnish a true copy of memorandum receipt.
- (5) Any other information or data pertinent to the obtaining of the item.

2. Supplementing Coastal Patrol Circular No. 5, Bomb Rack Installations, October 1, 1942, this Headquarters, the following information will be furnished.

- a. Total number and types of bomb racks installed.
- b. Where installed (name and location of depot)


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- c. Total number and type of bomb-sights installed and where installed. (Name and location of depot.)
- d. From what depot were bombs supplied.
- e. Status of ammunition:
