AAF LIAISON-TYPE AIRPLANES ALLOCATED TO
CAP AVIATION CADET RECRUITMENT PROGRAM

1. Effective this date, sub-paragraphs c and e, paragraph 25, Operations Directive No. 40, this Headquarters, "AAF Liaison Type Airplanes Allocated to CAP Aviation Cadet Recruitment Program", 1 July 1944, are changed to read as follows:

"25. Accident Reports

c. A copy of the completed AAF Form No. 14, "Report of Aircraft Accident" will be requested from the AAF Claims Officer investigating an accident and will be forwarded to this Headquarters through CAP channels, immediately upon receipt.

e. The provisions of Operations Directive No. 26, this Headquarters, 1 December 1942, "Accident Reports - CAP Operating Bases and Stations", will be accomplished and a complete CAP Accident Board Report submitted to this Headquarters through channels within ten (10) days following date of accident."
