Chapter I OPERATIONS

Search and Rescue

Central Missouri Composite Squadron hosted multiple Search and Rescue training events on the following dates.

9/18/21 - The unit participated in the first in-person Wing SAREX by 1 member joining staff at the ICP and the squadron van with personnel conducting a ramp check at COU Regional Airport.

10/16/21: A single day squadron focused exercise that started teaching the fundamentals of Ground Search and Rescue Operations with a goal of creating Ground Team Level 3 trainees.

12/3/21-12/5/21: The squadron planned and hosted a multi-day training exercise for Group 3, with members originally signing up from 2 other units and 1 attending. The instructional session and skills based sorties built on the prior training that was received on 10/16/21. One other Missouri ICS staff member had their qualification renewed virtually working with the IC.

Disaster Response

No Missions pertaining to Disaster Response were carried out by Central Missouri Composite Squadron during the year 2021. However, multiple members of the squadron were presented with the Disaster Response Ribbon for participating in the 2020 Covid-19 PPE mission in St Louis, MO. Additionally the unit participated in the Boone County Office of Emergency Management's inaugural Preparedness Fair in September 2021 by aiding with volunteer assignments on-site.

Homeland Security

No missions to support Homeland Security were performed by Central Missouri Composite Squadron.

No Missions for Counterdrug Operations were carried out by Central Missouri Composite Squadron.

Chapter II AEROSPACE EDUCATION

Internal Aerospace Education

Aerospace education remained a focus throughout the year. One meeting of every Month was dedicated to Aerospace Education with classes taught by Senior Members, Cadet Officers and NCOs, and guest speakers. Due to the ongoing constraints of COVID-19, no rocketry or sUAS training was carried out by the squadron. Central Missouri Composite Squadron was able to participate in multiple O-Ride days hosted by Missouri Wing Group 3. There were 8 O-rides in 2021.

External Aerospace Education

Central Missouri Composite Squadron contributed to Aerospace Education Events hosted by external organizations. Most notably, Cadets and Senior Members joined the local RC Aircraft Club during one of their flight days at a local RC Aircraft field.

Chapter III CADET PROGRAMS

Cadet Programs

Central Missouri Composite Squadron continued to be a highly Cadet focused Squadron in 2021. It had to focus on retaining remaining cadets as COVID-19 had taken a toll on membership. Weekly meetings focused on Cadet development in multiple areas (including drill, character development) in accordance with CAP Regulations. Two cadet members, C/Kreutz and C/Ridgeway, enlisted in the Army and enrolled in the Air Force Academy respectively. We kept them in touch through 2 virtual sessions with current cadets to encourage their ongoing commitment to the cadet program and their futures.

Cadet Activities

6/5/21: Cadets and Senior Members from Central Missouri Composite Squadron joined the Wentzville Composite Squadron for a STEM day at Six Flags St Louis. Members convened for Lunch and discussed STEM subjects in relation to the rides at the park.

7/17-7/24/21: One senior and 3 cadets participated in the Missouri Wing Summer Encampment, the first real in-person Wing activity of 2021 hosted after COVID-19 impacts started to diminish.

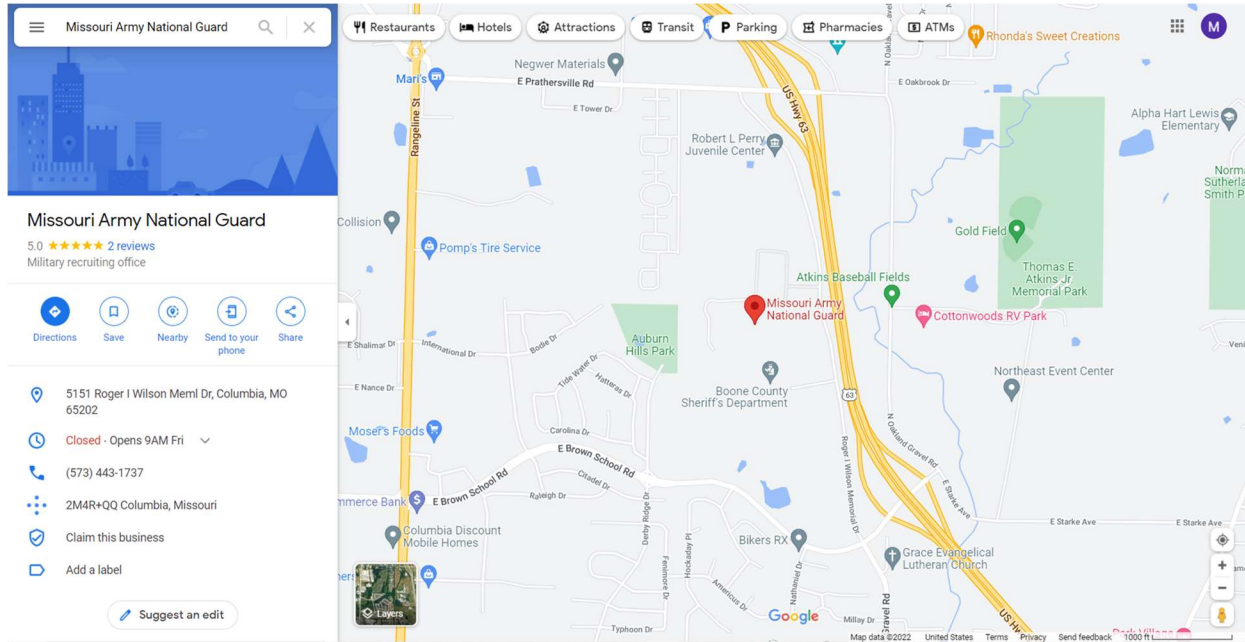
