Chapter I OPERATIONS

Search and Rescue

Considerable Flight training and ground team training was accomplished in the last half of 2021. SRCS took on the task of training Cadets and Seniors for Ground Team Member Leader and Ground Team Member 3.

Multiple weekend training events were conducted through the latter part of the year with an end goal of a Group SAREX in early Spring 2022.

During aircrew training 1 Mission Scanner was qualified with several others completing the ground school.

Disaster Response

Operations training consisted of aircrew, ground team, and Mission Base activities. Upon COVID reintegration, SRCS jumped into an all-day Group V air and ground operation. This involved multiple aircraft and ground teams performing missing ELT and bridge assessment survey's in the Lebanon, MO area.

Several Senior members started Mission Base staff training in Mission Staff Assistant and Air Operations Branch Director.

Chapter II AEROSPACE EDUCATION

Internal Aerospace Education

In the Fall of 2021, 25 cadets completed the Cross Country Flying STEM kit and started the rocketry program. November 2021, 5 cadets participated in the Lake of the Ozarks ASA rocketry event. Completion of this course would have provided the Rocketry Badge but unfortunately, weather conditions didn't allow completion.

Upon returning from the Lake of the Ozarks ASA event, the local squadron applied and received STEM rocketry kits which will be completed yearly in 2022. Upon completion, 25 plus cadets will qualify for the Rocketry Badge.

Cadets and Senior members participated in an opportunity to visit the Branson, MO CAP squadron to log flying time on the Red Bird flight simulator.

External Aerospace Education

SRCS participated in the Teacher Orientation Program (TOP) with a local Middle School. This involved 2 separate 3 hour classes teaching an 8th grade class which was followed by 2 educators receiving their TOP flights. This TOP flight received local media coverage and was air on the local news segment, as well as coverage in CAP NHQ publications.

SRCS made contact and flew the Bolivar, MO AFJROTC cadets which produced 15 flights. During this event, 2 CAP Cadets were on site and provided 30 minute presentations regarding the CAP Aerospace Education program.

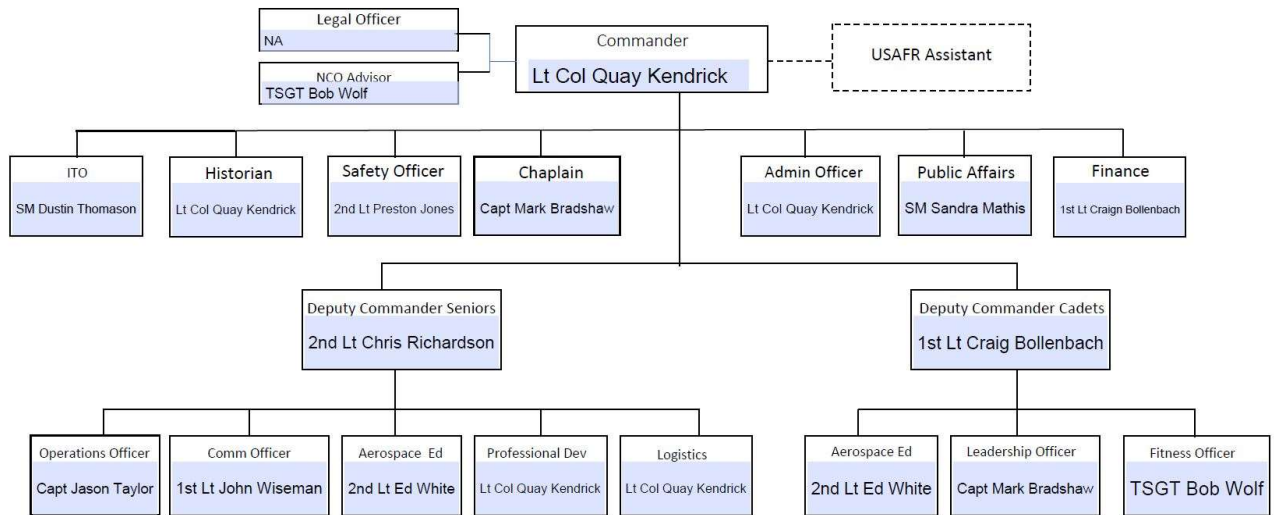
Cadet Programs

Unit Organization Chart

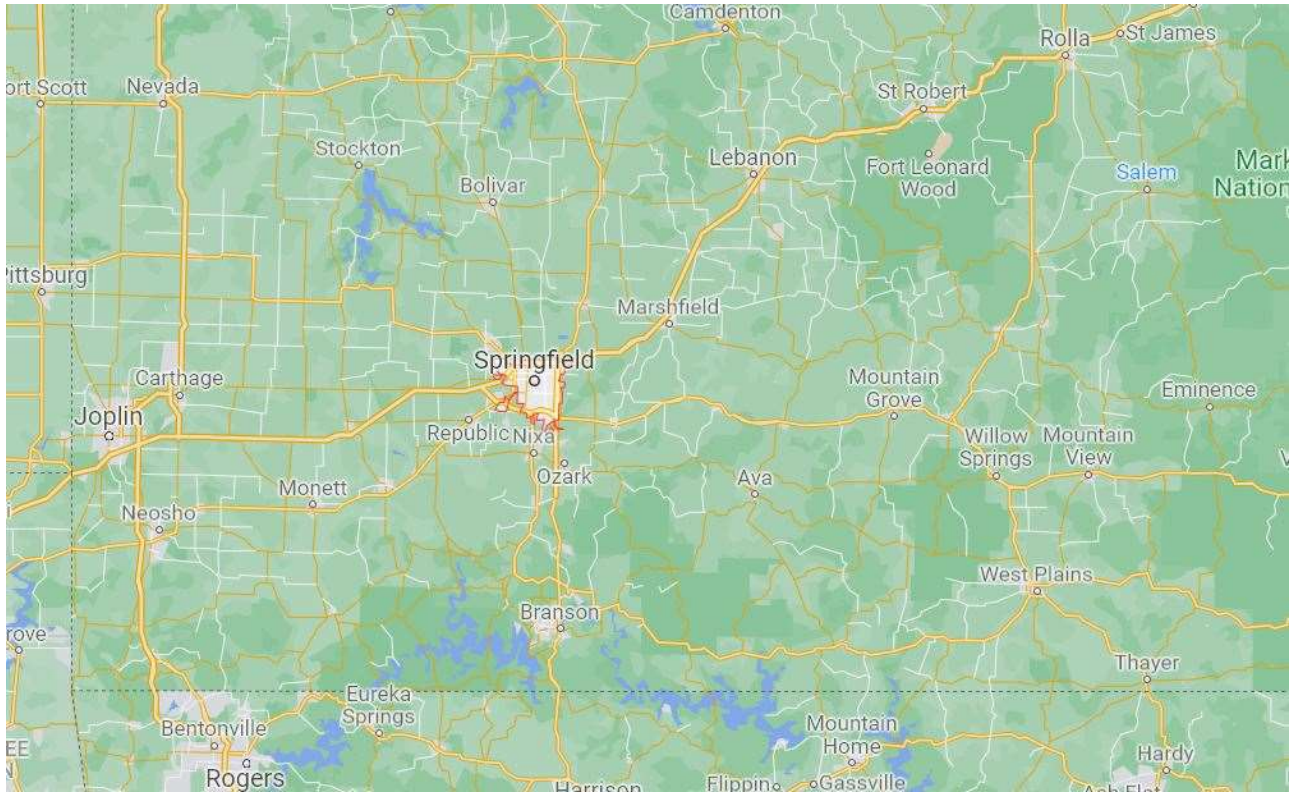
Springfield Regional Composite Squadron NCR-MO-070 Organizational Chart
