JANUARY 2018 REPORT

1. THERE WAS 1 CADET ORIENTATION RIDE IN JANUARY FROM OLIVE BRANCH. THERE IS CURRENTLY \$2,875 (41 SORTIES), REMAINING IN THE MISSION, OF WHICH \$2,500 WAS ADDED TO THE ACCOUNT BY NHQ FOR THE JANUARY CADET CONFERENCE (WHICH WAS CANCELLED DUE TO WEATHER).
2. THERE WERE NO MEMBER-FUNDED FORM 5 SORTIES FLOWN IN JANUARY. THERE IS CURRENTLY \$654 REMAINING ON FUNDED FLIGHT EVALUATION MISSION.
3. NO FUNDING HAS BEEN MADE BY NHQ TO THE ANNUAL MMPF PROFICIENCY FLYING MISSION.
4. NHQ HAS ADVISED THAT SHOULD BE SOME LIMITED AVAILABLE FUNDS FOR JROTC OR ROTC ORIENTATION FLIGHTS IN FEBRUARY.
5. THE NEW FLIGHT REGULATION CAPR 70-1 INCLUDES A REQUIREMENT FOR 2 IFR PILOTS ON ALL OVER-WATER FLIGHTS. A WAIVER REQUEST WAS SUBMITTED TO SOUTH EAST REGION TO ALLOW A SINGLE VFR PILOT TO CONTINUE TO FLY SUNDOWN PATROL.
6. THE OVERALL AVAILABILITY FOR THE 7 AIRCRAFT FOR JANUARY WAS 81% AND 81% YTD. DETAILS ATTACHED. N925CP HAS BEEN UNAVAILABLE FOR THE LAST 4 MONTHS DUE TO A 100 HOUR INSPECTION, REPLACEMENT ELT ISSUES, AND ADS-B INSTALLATION.
7. NEW PROFICIENCY PROFILES WERE ISSUED IN JANUARY. THE LARGEST CHANGE WAS THAT EACH PROFILE IDENTIFIES MANY ITEMS THAT ARE DESIGNATED AS REQUIRED FOR EACH SORTIE. PREVIOUSLY THE PILOT HAD THE OPTION TO SELECT WHICH ITEMS WERE TO BE COMPLETED ON THE SORTIE.

8. THE LOW LEVEL ROUTE SURVEY MISSION FOR COLUMBUS AIR FORCE BASE WAS APPROVED.

1. THERE WAS 4 CADET ORIENTATION RIDES IN FEBRUARY, 2 FROM KGPT AND 2 FROM WIGGINS. THERE IS CURRENTLY \$2,675 (38 SORTIES), REMAINING IN THE MISSION, OF WHICH \$2,500 WAS ADDED TO THE ACCOUNT BY NHQ FOR THE JANUARY CADET CONFERENCE (WHICH WAS CANCELLED DUE TO WEATHER).
2. THERE WERE NO MEMBER-FUNDED FORM 5 SORTIES FLOWN IN FEBRUARY.
3. THERE WERE 2 MEMBER-FUNDED C16 CADET TRAINING SORTIES FLOWN IN FEBRUARY BY ELIZABETH LITTLE FROM KGTR.
4. NO FUNDING HAS BEEN MADE BY NHQ FOR THE ANNUAL MMPF PROFICIENCY FLYING MISSION.
5. THERE WERE 10 JROTC ORIENTATION SORTIES FLOWN FOR NEW ALBANY HIGH SCHOOL FLOWN BY MS-096. NHQ IS EXPECTING MORE FUNDING IN MARCH FOR ROTC AND JROTC ORIENTATION FLIGHTS.
6. THE NEW FLIGHT REGULATION CAPR 70-1 INCLUDES A REQUIREMENT FOR 2 IFR PILOTS ON ALL OVER-WATER FLIGHTS. A WAIVER REQUEST HAS BEEN APPROVED FOR ONE YEAR FOR 1 IFR PILOT, BUT ONLY FOR TRANSPORTATION AND RELOCATION. IN ORDER TO CONTINUE SUNDOWN PATROLS, THE FLIGHT PROFILES HAVE BEEN MODIFIED TO REMAIN WITHIN GLIDING DISTANCE OF LAND.
7. IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE APPROVED WAIVER, NHQ REQUESTED A PROGRAM BE DEVELOPED TO QUALIFY MORE IFR-RATED PILOTS. GARRETT TIRPAK IS DEVELOPING THE PROGRAM.
8. THE OVERALL AVAILABILITY FOR THE 7 AIRCRAFT FOR JANUARY WAS 90% AND 82% YTD. DETAILS ATTACHED. N925CP HAD BEEN UNAVAILABLE FOR THE LAST 4.5 MONTHS DUE TO A 100 HOUR INSPECTION, REPLACEMENT ELT ISSUES, AND ADS-B INSTALLATION, FINALLY RETURNING TO SERVICE 16 FEB.
9. MSWG PARTICIPATION PATRIOT SOUTH EXERCISE IN GULFPORT INVOLVING MULTIPLE AGENCIES UNDER THE DIRECTION OF THE NATIONAL GUARD HAD TO BE CANCELLED DUE TO LACK OF FUNDING BY CAP.

1. THE INSTRUMENT PILOT TRAINING PROGRAM REQUESTED BY NHQ TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF INSTRUMENT PILOTS FOR EXTENDED OVERWATER OPERATIONS WAS SUBMITTED ON 28 MARCH TO SER, WHO HAS NOW APPROVED IT AND SENT IT TO NHQ. THANKS TO GARRETT TIRPAK FOR A JOB WELL DONE.
2. THERE WAS 14 CADET ORIENTATION RIDES IN MARCH, 3 FROM KGPT, 4 FROM KPQL, 4 FROM KOLV, AND 3 FROM KHKS. THERE IS CURRENTLY \$2,028 (29 SORTIES), REMAINING IN THE MISSION. \$2,500 WAS ADDED TO THE ACCOUNT BY NHQ FOR THE JANUARY CADET CONFERENCE (WHICH WAS CANCELLED DUE TO WEATHER).
3. THERE WERE 2 FORM 5 AND 1 FORM 91 MEMBER-FUNDED SORTIES FLOWN IN MARCH.
4. THERE WERE 3 MEMBER-FUNDED C16 CADET TRAINING SORTIES FLOWN IN MARCH BY ELIZABETH LITTLE FROM KGTR.
5. NO FUNDING HAS BEEN MADE BY NHQ FOR THE ANNUAL MMPF PROFICIENCY FLYING MISSION.
6. THERE WERE 12 JROTC ORIENTATION SORTIES FLOWN FOR LAFAYETTE HIGH SCHOOL FLOWN BY MS-096. RIDGELAND AND ST MARTIN HIGH SCHOOLS ARE APPROVED AND SCHEDULED IN APRIL. NHQ IS EXPECTING MORE FUNDING IN APRIL FOR ROTC AND JROTC ORIENTATION FLIGHTS. ADDITIONAL MISSION REQUESTS HAVE BEEN SUBMITTED FOR SOUTH PANOLA, MADISON CENTRAL, BAY, AND ROSA FORT JROTC UNITS, AS WELL AS THE ROTC UNITS.
7. THERE WERE 5 LOW LEVEL ROUTE SURVEY SORTIES FLOWN IN MARCH TOTALING 14.9 HOURS.
8. THE OVERALL AVAILABILITY FOR THE 7 AIRCRAFT FOR MARCH WAS 94% AND 84% YTD. THE AVERAGE HOURS FLOWN IN MARCH WAS 11.3 HOURS PER AIRCRAFT AND APPROXIMATELY 49.6 FOR THE 6 MONTHS YEAR-TO-DATE. DETAILS ATTACHED.

1. THERE WAS 11 CADET ORIENTATION RIDES IN MAY: 6 FROM KPQL, 4 FROM KTUP, AND 1 FROM KGTR. THERE IS CURRENTLY \$534 (7 SORTIES), REMAINING IN THE MISSION. A REQUEST FOR CADET ORIENTATION FLIGHT FUNDING WILL BE SUBMITTED TO NHQ THIS WEEK.
2. THERE WERE NO MEMBER-FUNDED FORM 5 OR 91 SORTIES FLOWN IN MAY.
3. THERE WERE 4 MEMBER-FUNDED C16 CADET TRAINING SORTIES FLOWN IN MAY BY ELIZABETH LITTLE FROM KGTR.
4. THERE WERE 7 SORTIES FLOWN IN MAY ON THE ANNUAL MPPF PROFICIENCY FLYING MISSION BY 5 DIFFERENT PILOTS. THERE PROFILES FLOWN WERE: 5 SORTIES #4 – CROSS COUNTRY AND 2 SORTIES #10 – TAKEOFFS AND LANDINGS.
5. THERE WERE 7 JROTC ORIENTATION SORTIES FLOWN IN MAY FOR SOUTH PANOLA HIGH SCHOOL FLOWN BY MS-096. MADISON CENTRAL, BAY, AND ROSA FORT JROTC UNITS WERE ALSO APPROVED IN EARLY MAY BUT COULD NOT BE EXECUTED DUE TO THE LATENESS IN THE SCHOOL YEAR.
6. 2 ROTC UNITS (MSU AND OLE MISS) HAVE RESPONDED AS VERY INTERESTED IN FLYING 1 HOUR CADET ORIENTATION FLIGHTS IN LATE AUGUST/EARLY SEPTEMBER FOR A TOTAL OF 18 SORTIES. IT IS LIKELY THAT JSU WILL JOIN IN ALSO. A MISSION REQUEST WILL BE SUBMITTED.
7. THERE WAS 1 LOW LEVEL ROUTE SURVEY SORTIE FLOWN IN MAY TOTALING 2.4 HOURS.
8. FOR HARRISON/HANCOCK SUNDOWN PATROL, THERE WERE 6 SORTIES TOTALING 10.2 HOURS IN MAY.
9. FOR JACKSON SUNDOWN PATROL, THERE WERE 6 SORTIES TOTALING 9.7 HOURS IN MAY.
10. FOR MDMR AERIAL RECON, THERE WAS 1 SORTIE TOTALING 2.6 HOURS IN MAY.
11. THE OVERALL AVAILABILITY FOR THE 7 AIRCRAFT FOR MAY WAS 71% AND 84% YTD. THE INDIVIDUAL AIRCRAFT RANGED FROM A YTD HIGH OF 99.2% FOR N829CP TO A YTD LOW OF 44.4% FOR N925CP.
12. THE AVERAGE HOURS FLOWN IN MAY WAS 16.7 HOURS PER THE 5.5 OPERATIONAL AIRCRAFT AND APPROXIMATELY 82 HOURS FOR THE 8 MONTHS YEAR-TO-DATE. DETAILS ATTACHED.

JUNE 2018 REPORT

1. CADET ORIENTATION RIDES WERE FLOWN AS PART OF THE MS-AL ENCAMPMENT. THERE WERE A TOTAL OF 51 CADET SORTIES FLOWN ON 28 JUNE. IN ADDITION, THERE WERE 20 RELOCATION SORTIES TO MOVE AIRCRAFT TO/FROM THE EVENT. ALL 7 MSWG AIRCRAFT AND 9 PILOTS PARTICIPATED, ALONG WITH 3 AIRCRAFT AND PILOTS FROM ALWG. TOTAL AIRCRAFT FUEL COST WAS \$3,150.
2. THERE WAS ONLY ONE ADDITIONAL CADET O-FLIGHT IN THE MONTH FLOWN FROM KOLV.
3. THERE WERE 8 “JUNE SPECIAL” PROFICIENCY SORTIES TOTALING 14.0 HOURS AND \$700.23 FUEL.
4. THERE WAS 1 MEMBER-FUNDED FORM 5 SORTIES FLOWN IN JUNE.
5. THERE WERE NO MEMBER-FUNDED C16 CADET TRAINING SORTIES FLOWN IN JUNE.
6. THERE WERE 10 SORTIES FLOWN IN JUNE ON THE ANNUAL MPPF PROFICIENCY FLYING MISSION BY 9 DIFFERENT PILOTS. THERE PROFILES FLOWN WERE: 2 SORTIES #1 – VISUAL SEARCH, 6 SORTIES #4 – CROSS COUNTRY, 1 SORTIE #5 – FORM 91 PRACTICE, AND 1 SORTIE #10 – TAKEOFFS AND LANDINGS.
7. THERE WERE NO JROTC ORIENTATION SORTIES FUNDED IN JUNE. BAY HIGH SCHOOL HAS EXPRESSED AN INTEREST IN FLYING CADETS IN LATE AUGUST/EARLY SEPTEMBER. FUNDING WILL BE REQUESTED FROM NHQ, AND MISSION REQUEST WILL BE SUBMITTED.
8.
