SUBJECT: 2018 New Mexico Wing Annual History

1. Civil Air Patrol's New Mexico Wing made 2018 a year to remember. The Wing re-chartered the Albuquerque Institute for Mathematics and Science (AIMS) Cadet Squadron and chartered a new middle school squadron in Clovis. Carlos F. Vigil Middle School Squadron continues to enlist new cadets, and now has over 90 members on its rolls. Aerospace Education and Cadet Programs provided youth with visits to the Challenger Learning Center in Las Cruces and rocket launches at White Sands Missile Range in Alamogordo. Cadet encampments and glider- and powered-plane orientation rides help inspire participants to excel in the STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math), and to help develop their leadership skills. Five New Mexico Wing squadrons received CAP's Quality Cadet Unit Award for 2018.

2. The Wing flew Air Force Research Laboratory personnel to Playas, N.M., as well as 55 sorties totaling 73 flight hours for Falcon Virgo. The hot-air balloon program continues to keep CAP's name in the public eye, as do recruiting and retention efforts and participation in a variety of state and local activities. Cadet Col. Destiny Maurer of the LBJ Middle School Cadet Squadron and Cadet Col. Dakota Cisneros of the Santa Fe Composite Squadron received the Gen. Carl A. Spaatz Award – the highest award a cadet can achieve, and a feat accomplished by less than one-half of one percent of all cadets

**INTRODUCTION OF UNIT STAFF & BRIEF UNIT NARRATIVE**

The New Mexico Wing was one of the original wings chartered by Civil Air Patrol on Dec. 1, 1941. It is located at Kirtland AFB in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

**Wing Commander** Col. Mike Lee has been New Mexico Wing commander since June 2015. He succeeded then-Col. Mark E. Smith, who went on to become Southwest Region commander and then, CAP's National Commander. He has two Vice Commanders who supervise the squadron commanders assigned to them: the Vice-Commander - North, who supervises all squadrons located north of Interstate 40; and the Vice Commander - South, who supervises all squadrons south of I-40.

**SUMMARY NARRATIVE OF MAJOR ACTIVITIES**

**Chapter I OPERATIONS**

Search and Rescue

FOLLOWING A DECLINE IN REDCAPS (ACTUAL SEARCH AND RESCUE MISSIONS) IN FY 2017, NEW MEXICO WING SAW A 50% INCREASE IN REDCAP MISSIONS DURING THE YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2018. WE ALSO PARTICIPATED IN THE MOST AIRCRAFT SORTIES IN THE PAST FIVE YEARS.(SEE APPENDIX FOR STATISTICS)

THE MOST HIGH-PROFILE AIRCRAFT SEARCH WAS FOR A PIPER LANCE WITH FOUR SOULS FROM ALBERTA, CANADA. THE AIRCRAFT DEPARTED GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO, WITH A PLANNED DESTINATION OF ALBUQUERQUE, NEW MEXICO. NEW MEXICO CAP WAS TASKED TO SEARCH FOR THE AIRCRAFT IN UTAH, BECAUSE SNOWSTORMS IN NORTHERN UTAH AND COLORADO PRECLUDED THOSE STATES FROM FLYING IN SOUTHEASTERN UTAH. A NEW MEXICO AIRCREW CONDUCTED AN ELT (EMERGENCY LOCATOR TRANSMITTER) SEARCH, IN IFR CONDITIONS, THAT ULTIMATELY LED TO A COLORADO CAP GROUND CREW LOCATING THE DOWNED AIRCRAFT IN SOUTHEASTERN UTAH.

TRAGICALLY, THE PILOT FLEW INTO A SNOWSTORM AND LITERALLY FLEW INTO THE GROUND, ATTEMPTING TO STAY BENEATH THE CLOUD DECK. WHAT WAS UNIQUE ABOUT THIS MISSION WAS COORDINATING NOTIFICATION TO THE FAMILY THROUGH THE CANADIAN CONSUL GENERAL'S OFFICE IN DENVER, AND THE CANADIAN RESCUE CENTER TO MAKE NOTIFICATION TO THE FAMILY. THE NEW MEXICO WING WAS BOTH SADDENED AT THIS TRAGIC LOSS OF LIFE, BUT GLAD TO HELP BRING CLOSURE TO THE FAMILY.

THE AIR FORCE RESCUE COORDINATION CENTER CREDITED NEW MEXICO CAP WITH SEVEN FINDS DURING THE YEAR.

#### Disaster Relief

THERE WERE NO DISASTER RELIEF TRAINING, EVALUATION OR RECOVERY MISSIONS DURING THIS PERIOD BY NEW MEXICO WING.

#### Homeland Security

NEW MEXICO WING PARTICIAPTED IN TWO FALCON VIRGO CULMINATING TRAINING EVENTS (CTE) FOR THE NATIONAL CAPITAL DEFENSE BATTALION OVER WHITE SANDS MISSILE RANGE AND MCGREGOR RANGES/RESTRICTED AREAS. THE FIRST EXERCISE WAS 5-12 JANUARY, AND THREE WING AIRCRAFT FLEW 28 SORTIES FOR A TOTAL OF 78.4 HOURS. THE SECOND EXERCISE WAS 6-13 OCTOBER, AND THREE WING AIRCRAFT FLEW 20 SOTIES FOR A TOTAL OF 74.6 HOURS.

LOW-LEVEL ROUTE SURVEYS WERE FLOWN FOR CANNON AFB FROM FEBRUARY TO SEPTEMBER, USING EIGHT AIRCRAFT WITH 33 SORTIES FOR A TOTAL OF 105 HOURS.

AIR FORCE RESEARCH LABORATORY AND NEW MEXICO TECH PERSONNEL WERE FLOWN FROM ALBUQUERQUE TO PLAYAS, N.M., TO CONDUCT SITE SURVEYS IN MAY AND AUGUST, USING THREE AIRCRAFT EACH TIME, WITH A TOTAL OF 24 SORTIES AND 31.4 HOURS FLOWN

IN MARCH, ONE AIRCRAFT PROVIDED A RADAR TARGET FOR THE MACROSYSCOM PROJECT AT WHITE SANDS MISSLIE RANGE, FLYING TWO SORTIES AND 7.8 HOURS

AS MEMBERS OF THE NEW MEXICO NATIONAL GUARD JOINT STAFF, THE NEW MEXICO WING CONTINUES TO PROVIDE COORDINATION OF JOINT PLANS AS DOCUMENTED IN THE NEW MEXICO NATIONAL GUARD-JOINT FORCE HEADQUARTERS ALL HAZARDS PLAN, IN SUPPORT OF FUTURE VIGILANT GUARD AND OTHER HOMELAND SECURITY EXERCISES. THIS ACTIVITY HAS LED TO INCREASED VISIBILITY OF THE CAP MISSION, ROLES AND CAPABILITIES IN SUPPORT OF HOMELAND SECURITY.

ADDITIONALLY, OPERATIONS PERSONNEL ENSURED THAT AIRCRAFT WERE AVIALABLE FOR CAP CADET AND JROTC ORIENTATION RIDES (O-RIDES), PROFICIENCY FLYING, CHECK PILOT TRAINING, FLIGHT EVALUATIONS, MAINTENANCE FLIGHTS, STAFF TRANSPORTATION AND AIRCRAFT OR PERSONNEL RELOCATIONS. THE TOTAL NUMBER OF POWERED SORTIES WAS 1615, FOR A TOTAL OF 2490 FLYING HOURS.

#### Counterdrug

NEW MEXICO WING WAS RECOGNIZED BY CIVIL AIR PATROL FOR HAVING THE BEST COUNTERDRUG PROGRAM OF 2018.

THE COUNTERDRUG (CD) OPERATIONS CONTINUE TO SUPPORT CBP (CUSTOMS AND BORDER PATROL) AND LEA (LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES) ALONG THE NEW MEXICO BORDER. CAP CD AIRCREWS FLY WITH CBP AGENT RIDERS TO SUPPORT GROUND UNITS TRACKING UDAS (UNDOCUMENTED ALIENS), RESPONDING TO SENSOR ALERTS AND DETERRING BORDER CROSSINGS. CAP SORTIES ARE SCHEDULED TWICE A WEEK, WITH LAS CRUCES AND LORDSBURG AGENTS SUPPORTING BORDER AORS (AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY). CAP CREWS RELOCATE FROM ALBUQUERQUE, AND OTHER NEW MEXICO SQUADRONS, TO HELP SUPPORT THE BORDER FLYING. THE NEW MEXICO WING CURRENTLY HAS ABOUT 35 QUALIFIED COUNTERDRUG MEMBERS.

THE NEW MEXICO COUNTERDRUG OFFICE COORDINATES WITH OTHER FLYING ASSETS FROM ALAMOGORDO AND THE NEW MEXICO NATIONAL GUARD TO COVER THE BORDER AT APPROPRIATE TIMES. AIR INTELLIGENCE TELECOM MEETINGS ARE HELD BI-WEEKLY, AND INFORMATION IS PASSED TO UPDATE ACTIVITIES. AN ANNUAL CAP COUNTERDRUG AFTER-ACTION MEETING ENCOURAGES CROSS-FLOW BETWEEN CAP UNITS OF THE FOUR WINGS ALONG THE MEXICAN BORDER: CALIFORNIA, ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND TEXAS. LEGAL BRIEFINGS ARE ALSO GIVEN EACH YEAR FOR AIRCREWS TO HAVE THE LATEST FEDERAL MANDATE FOR POSSE COMITATUS OPERATION.

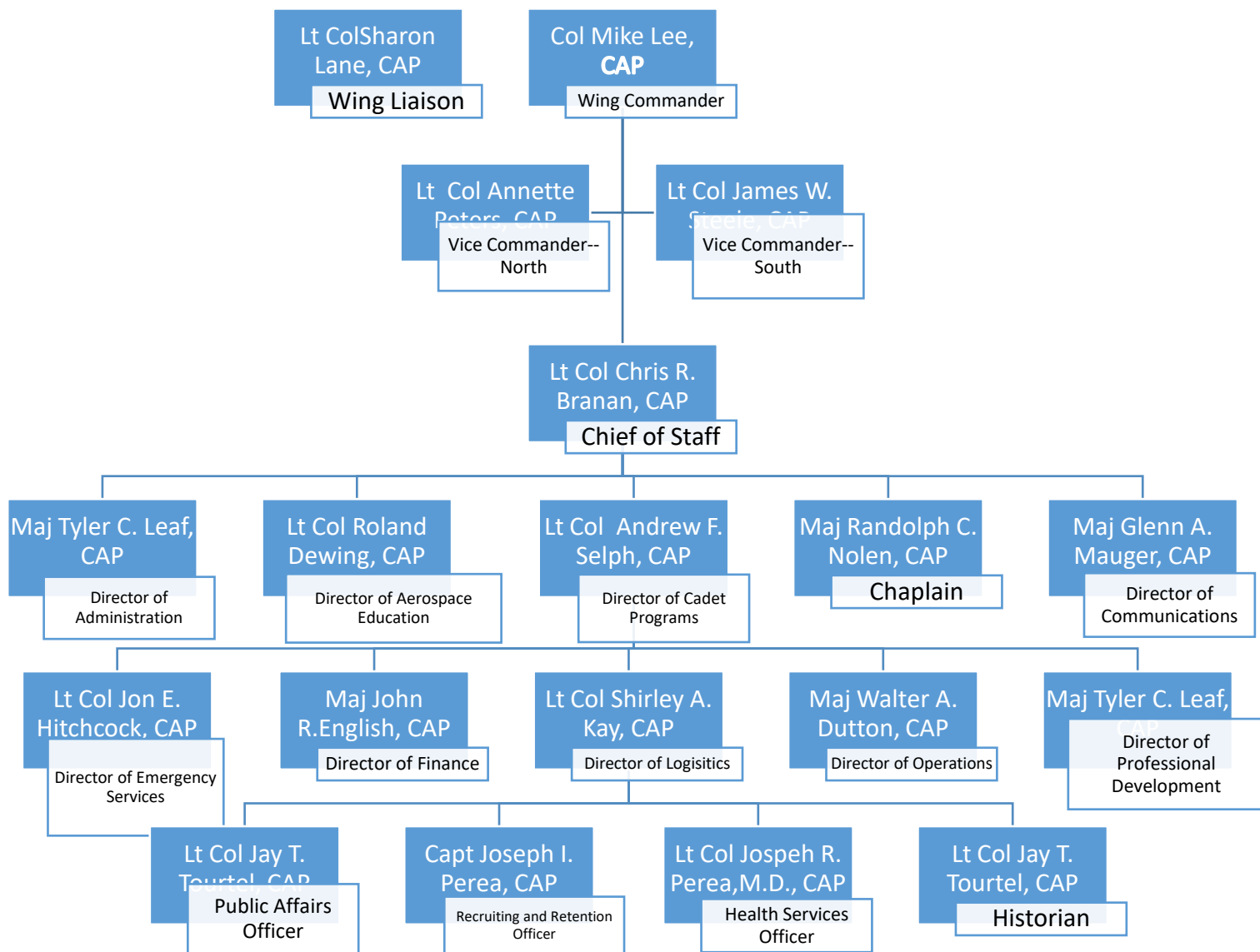
