**SUBJECT:** Approval of NVWG Annual History for 2020

This past year has been the singularly most difficult and challenging year for the Civil Air Patrol and the Nevada Wing during our 80-year history. Never in our history have we been faced with such challenges: trying to maintain a rich, meaningful program of leadership and education for our cadets when they were not permitted to attend meetings and activities due to a world-wide pandemic; trying to maintain our critical Emergency Services skills and readiness in the face of the same limitations, including civil unrest across the nation; massive wildfires burning through our state and neighboring states. Despite these hurdles, all occurring simultaneously, the cadets and senior members of Nevada Wing stood tall and were still able to respond to calls for real-world disaster relief missions as well as several search and rescue missions without missing a beat.

I am deeply proud and honored to have commanded the outstanding cadets and senior members of the Nevada Wing during this year of unprecedented national crisis.

Please accept this memorandum as proof of my approval of the Nevada Wing's Annual History for 2020.

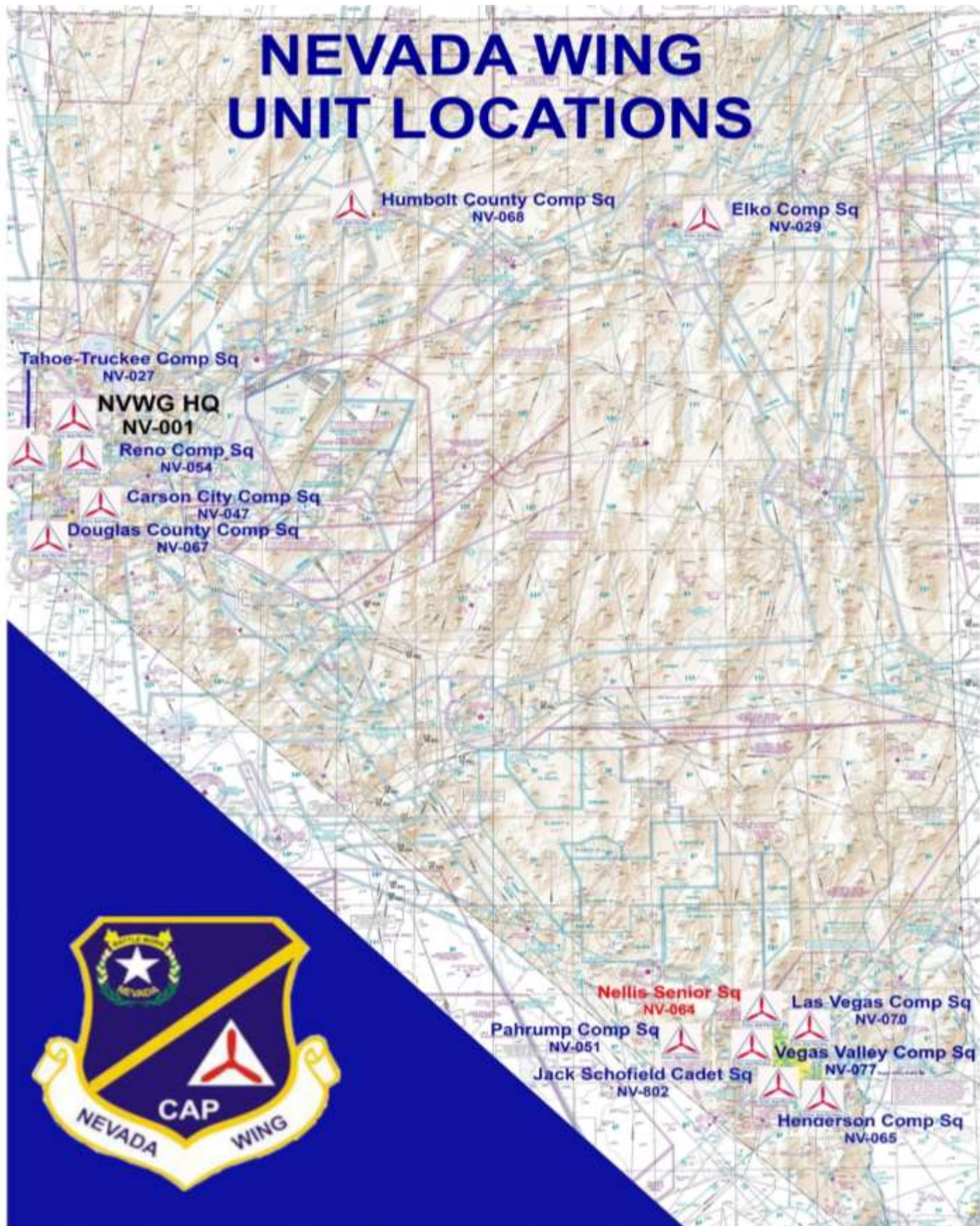

## **CHRONOLOGY 2020**

### **January**

- 1** Wing membership stands at 714 (279 cadets and 435 senior members).
- 7** NVWG conducted a wing staff meeting and commanders call teleconference.
- 11** NVWG conducted a Northern Drone Competition in Minden. Cadets from Carson City Composite Squadron (NV-047) and Douglas County Composite Squadron (NV-067) competed.
- 25** 20-T-4370. Elko Composite Squadron (NV-029), Henderson Composite Squadron (NV-065), and Douglas Composite Squadron (NV-067), participated in a one-day SAREX. There were seventeen air sorties flown and nine ground sorties conducted. Seventy-eight members participated.
- 25** The Reno Composite Squadron (NV-054) underwent a Subordinate Unit Inspection by the NVWG/IG and a member of the NVWG staff, augmented with one member from region headquarters and two members from other squadrons. The overall summary grade for the unit was "Effective".
- 25** The Henderson Composite Squadron (NV-065) underwent a Subordinate Unit Inspection by four members of the NVWG staff and one member from a nearby squadron. The overall summary grade for the unit was "Effective".
- 23-31** 20-T-4372. NVWG flew thirty-two air sorties and conducted three ground sorties in support of Green Flag West. Twenty-eight members participated.



- 25-31** 20-T-4201. NVWG flew fifteen air sorties and conducted one ground sortie in support of Green Flag West. Sixteen members participated.
- 25** The Henderson Composite Squadron (NV-065) underwent a Subordinate Unit Inspection by members of the Nevada Wing Staff, augmented with a member from nearby squadron. The overall summary grade for the unit was "Effective".

## **February**

- 1-3** 20-T-4372. NVWG flew an additional six air sorties and conducted two ground sorties in support of Green Flag West.
- 1-29** 20-T-4500. NVWG flew forty-six air sorties in support of Green Flag West. Twenty-two members participated.
- 8-29** 20-T-4373. NVWG conducted a wing-wide SAREX, with bases in Southern Clark County, Minden, Elko, and Reno. There were nine air sorties flown and six ground sorties conducted. Sixty-eight members participated.
- 15** Reno Composite Squadron (NV-054) conducted a model rocket launch as the culmination of their recent Model Rocketry effort. The launch site was the Stead Dry Lakebed.
- 18** NVWG held a wing staff meeting and commanders call teleconference.
- 18-29** 20-T-4371. NVWG provided orientation flights to the UNLV AFROTC unit. Twenty-four flights were conducted.
- 22** The Vegas Valley Composite Squadron (NV-077) underwent a Subordinate Unit Inspection by four members of the NVWG staff, augmented with two members from

nearby squadrons. The overall summary grade for the unit was “Effective”.

**27-29** The 2020 CAP Legislative Day and Winter Command Council was held in Washington, D.C. Col Pierce attended.

## **March**

**4-24** 20-T-4709. NVWG flew twenty-three air sorties in support of Green Flag West. Twenty-one members participated.

**5** Nevada’s first case of COVID-19 was identified in Las Vegas.

**10** The CAP-USAF Inspector General issued its report on the NVWG’s biannual Compliance Inspection (CI), which was conducted during the period 28 January to 8 March by members of CAP-USAF. The overall summary grade for the wing was “Effective”.

**12** Governor Sisolak declared a state of emergency due to the of the COVID-19 virus in Nevada. In a separate order, he ordered the closing of all K-12 schools within the state.

**14** Col Pierce ordered the suspension of all in-person meetings within NVWG, with the exception of actual missions, in order to help counter the spread of the COVID-19 virus.

**14** The National Commander ordered the cessation of non-mission essential activities, meetings, and travel nationwide effective immediately to help counter the spread of the COVID-19 virus.

**15-22** 20-T-4524. NVWG provided orientation flights to the Northern Valley High School AFJROTC detachment. Twenty flights were conducted.

**16** Nevada’s first COVID-19 death occurred in Clark County.

- 17** NVWG held a wing staff meeting/teleconference.
- 19** The NVWG CAC hosted the first wing-wide study session via the NVWG Discord.
- 20** Governor Sisolak issued an order closing all non-essential businesses within the state of Nevada to help counter the spread of the COVID-19 virus.
- 20** The first NVWG Kahoot Competition took place. The winning teams were Carson City Composite Squadron (NV-047), Henderson Composite Squadron (NV-065 Team A), Reno Composite Squadron (NV-054), and Douglas County Composite Squadron (NV-067). The winning teams advanced to the next round. The highest individual score was achieved by C/Capt Surwill (NV-65).
- 21** The Douglas County Composite Squadron (NV-067) underwent a Subordinate Unit Inspection by the NVWG/IG and a member of the NVWG staff, augmented with one member from region headquarters and three members from other squadrons. The overall summary grade for the unit was “Effective”.
- 21** The Las Vegas Composite Squadron (NV-070) underwent a Subordinate Unit Inspection by four members of the NVWG staff. The overall summary grade for the unit was “Effective”.
- 24** Governor Sisolak issued an order restricting the size of gatherings for the state of Nevada to help counter the spread of the COVID-19 virus.
- 25** C/TSgt Goff (NV-054) taught the first online aerospace class for NVWG cadets.
- 26** Lt Col Pasinski hosted the first ever wing wide virtual squadron meeting.

- 27** The second round of the Nevada Wing Kahoot Competition took place. The Henderson Composite Squadron (NV-065) and the Reno Composite Squadron (NV-054) were declared the winners. The highest individual score was earned by C/Amn Gavin Ashby (NV-054).
- 31** Governor Sisolak issued a 'stay at home' order for the state of Nevada to help counter the spread of the COVID-19 virus.

## **April**

- 2** Lt Col Pasinski hosted a wing wide virtual squadron meeting.
- 3** The final round of the Nevada Wing Kahoot Competition took place. The Henderson Composite Squadron (NV-065) was declared the winner, and the highest individual score was earned by C/Capt Dana Surwill (NV-065).
- 4** The National Commander ordered the immediate cessation of all cadet orientation and training flights to help counter the spread of the COVID-19 virus.
- 7** The National Commander ordered the immediate cessation of all non-mission essential activities and meetings nationwide to help counter the spread of the COVID-19 virus.
- 8** Governor Sisolak issued an order closing non-essential businesses (including barber shops) within the state of Nevada to help counter the spread of the COVID-19 virus.
- 8** An online Character Development lesson for all NVWG cadets was conducted by 2<sup>nd</sup> Lt Holly Addleman (NV-065). This was the first of several sessions that would be delivered online due to COVID-19 meeting restrictions and yet allow cadets to continue to progress in their advancements.

- 9** Lt Col Pasinski hosted a wing wide virtual squadron meeting.
- 10** The NVWG CAC conducted a virtual debate competition, which allowed cadets from all parts of the state to participate despite the state's 'stay at home' order of 31 May. The debate topic was "Nature vs Nurture: Are Leaders Born or Made?" The winning team was made up of C/CMSgt Petrisca (NV-065) and C/MSgt Hranac (NV-054)
- 15** The National Commander, Maj Gen Smith, conducted a virtual briefing with the members of NVWG. Sixty-one members participated.
- 17** The NVWG CAC conducted another round of virtual cadet debate competition. The topic of debate was "SAREXes vs Orientation Flights." The winner was C/2d Lt Anderson (NV-065).
- 18** NVWG held a virtual staff and commanders call.
- 20** 20-C-5031. NVWG conducted the first ground sorties in support of COVID-19 Helping Hands of Vegas Valley, delivering food packages for disbursement to families severely affected by the economic shutdown caused by the pandemic. Eight sorties were conducted this first day of operation.
- 20** The NVWG CAC began conducting an online wing-wide PT activity, in order to encourage cadets to stay motivated in their physical fitness.
- 23-24** 20-T-4912. NVWG flew two air sorties and conducted one ground sortie in support of Green Flag West. Nine members participated.
- 24-25** 20-T-4913. NVWG conducted a virtual wing wide SAREX. Forty-three members participated.

**24** The NVWG CAC conducted a virtual wing-wide “Psych!” trivia competition. This mobile trivia game allowed cadets from across the wing to compete in general trivia knowledge through the app. Two rounds were completed in total, and the winners were C/1st Lt Gelfer (NV-802) and C/2d Lt Anderson (NV-065).

**30** 20-C-5031. NVWG conducted one ground sortie in support of COVID-19 Helping Hands of Vegas Valley, delivering food packages.

## **May**

**1** The NVWG CAC conducted the NVWG “Kahoot” competition. This competition consisted of 60+ CAP trivia questions, including aerospace, drill and ceremonies, and general CAP knowledge. The top 3 winners were C/Maj Surwill (NV-065), C/2d Lt Anderson (NV-065), and C/SrA Ramirez (NV-070).

**3-30** 20-T-5062. NVWG flew fourteen air sorties and conducted one ground sortie in support of Green Flag West. Twenty-seven members participated.

**5** The NVWG “Aerospace Education DIY Challenge” commenced. This competition consisted of two classes – one for seniors and one for cadets – and would last one month. Entrants in each class were challenged to design something that was related to aerospace education theory, topics, or modules, and that used only items found within the home. The designed items were required to function.

**12** 20-C-5031. NVWG conducted two ground sorties in support of COVID-19 Helping Hands of Vegas Valley, delivering food packages.

- 14-15** 20-M-0208A. Ten members of NVWG located and silenced an ELT at North Las Vegas Airport. NVWG awarded FIND credit.
- 14** 20-C-5031. NVWG conducted two ground sorties in support of COVID-19 Helping Hands of Vegas Valley, delivering food packages.
- 15** 20-C-5031. NVWG conducted three ground sorties in support of COVID-19 Helping Hands of Vegas Valley, delivering food packages.
- 19** 20-C-5031. NVWG conducted two ground sorties in support of COVID-19 Helping Hands of Vegas Valley, delivering food packages.
- 20** Due to uncertainties caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the decision is made to cancel the 2020 NVWG Cadet Encampment.
- 21** 20-C-5031. NVWG conducted a ground sortie in support of COVID-19 Helping Hands of Vegas Valley, delivering food packages.
- 24** 20-M-0234A. NVWG flew ten sorties in support of a search for a missing ATV rider east of the north end of Lake Mead. Victim found alive by another agency. Twenty-seven members participated. NVWG awarded FIND and SAVE credit.
- 27** The NVWG CAC hosted the first cadet virtual “Karaoke Competition” for morale building.
- 28** 20-C-5031. NVWG conducted a ground sortie in support of COVID-19 Helping Hands of Vegas Valley.
- 28-29** 20-M-0249A. NVWG flew two sorties in support of a search for a missing hunter near Searchlight. Victim found alive by another agency. Twelve members participated. NVWG awarded FIND and SAVE credit.

- 31** As a result of civil unrest erupting across the nation, and with demonstrations and rioting occurring in Nevada as well, Col Pierce, in the interest of members' safety, issued an order restricting members to wearing the corporate polo shirt uniform when in public and while performing COVID-19 transportation support missions.

## **June**

- 2-30** 20-T-5165. NVWG flew twenty-one air sorties and conducted one ground sortie in support of Green Flag West. Twenty-one members participated.

- 4** 20-C-5031. NVWG conducted a ground sortie in support of COVID-19 Helping Hands of Vegas Valley, delivering food packages. This was the final sortie for the mission.

The final tally for this effort was NVWG delivered 840 meals to seniors that could not leave their homes due to the pandemic that otherwise would have starved. A further 5,000 meals and 1,000 paper product bags were packaged for distribution to other seniors by Helping Hands.

There were a total of 17 sorties for this mission, and 23 members of NVWG participated.

- 4** 20-C-5168. NVWG members assembled 620 critically needed face shields for distribution to first responders at medical facilities throughout the Vegas Valley.

There were a total of 2 sorties for this mission, and 4 members of NVWG participated.

- 10** NVWG held a virtual staff meeting.

- 16** With civil unrest abating, Col Pierce rescinded her order restricting members to wear of the corporate polo uniform.



- 17** NVWG held a virtual staff and commanders call.
- 18** 20-M-0303A. NVWG flew two sorties in support of a search for a missing hiker at Valley of Fire State Park. Victim found alive by another agency. Eight members participated. NVWG awarded FIND and SAVE credit.
- 24** The NVWG CAC hosted another morale building virtual “Karaoke Night”, this time a competition between cadets and senior members. After a long battle, NVWG cadets were judged to have won the event.
- 25** 20-M-0321A. NVWG flew two sorties in support of a search for possible missing persons at a mudslide near Awakening Peak. Eleven members participated.
- 28-29** 20-M-0331A. NVWG flew two sorties in support of a search for a missing hiker in the vicinity of Ruby Mountain, near Elko. Fifteen members participated. NVWG awarded FIND and SAVE credit.

**July**

- 1-26** 20-T-5280. NVWG flew twenty-six air sorties and conducted two ground sorties in support of Green Flag West. Twenty-four members participated.
- 4** NVWG conducted a ‘virtual parade’. The NVWG CAC collected photographs of NVWG members (most performing COVID-19 relief efforts) and assembled them into a 1:58 collage, which was disseminated via various social media platforms and uploaded to YouTube.
- 8** NVWG held a virtual staff meeting.
- 12-23** 20-1-5209. NVWG flew thirteen air sorties conducting Low Level Route Surveys for the US Air Force as requested by the 60<sup>th</sup> Operational Support Squadron of Travis AFB. Thirty-five members participated.

- 15** NVWG held a virtual staff and commanders call.
- 27** 20-M-0425A. NVWG conducted one ground sortie in support of a search for and activated ELT in the vicinity of Reno-Stead Airport. Two members participated.

## **August**

- 5-27** 20-T-5458. NVWG flew twenty-four air sorties and conducted one ground sortie in support of Green Flag West. Eighteen members participated.
- 8-10** 20-M-0464A. NVWG flew four sorties in support of a search for a missing family of four hiker in Nye County. Victims found alive by another agency. Fifteen members participated. NVWG awarded FIND and four SAVES credit.
- 12** NVWG held a virtual staff meeting.
- 14-15** The 2020 National Conference was conducted virtually for the first time due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Numerous members of NVWG attended. Capt Maryan Tooker, NVWG PAO, received a Major Howell Baslem Award in the Brochure/ Poster/Flyer category for the “2019 Nevada Wing Conference Welcome Poster”.
- 16-18** 20-M-0493A. NVWG flew eight sorties in support of a search for a missing rock collector in Lincoln County. Twenty-two members participated.
- 19** NVWG held a virtual staff and commanders call.
- 24-25** 20-M-0515A. NVWG flew eight sorties in support of a search for a missing hang glider pilot in Nye County. Twenty-two members participated.

## **September**

## **SUMMARY NARRATIVE OF MAJOR ACTIVITIES**

### **Chapter I OPERATIONS**

#### **Search and Rescue**

Nevada Wing participated in Search and Rescue (SAR) missions and training in 2020. The NVWG Chief of Staff, Lt Col Gene Pasinski, Director of Operations, Col Russell Smith, and the Director of Emergency Services, Maj Darrin Scheidle, worked with the squadron ES and Ops Officers to coordinate aircrew, ground team, sUAS, UDF and mission base staff training with 5 training missions conducted. Actual missions during the year included 8 for missing persons and 3 for activated ELTs.

#### **Disaster Relief**

The Civil Air Patrol (CAP), acting in its capacity as the U.S. Air Force Auxiliary (AFAUX), provided mission support to multiple state/local and Federal partners in response to nation-wide outbreak of the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). Unless specified, these were Defense Support of Civil Authorities (DSCA) missions and the approving authority was the Commander, 1<sup>st</sup> Air Force. The missions NVWG participated in were approved by CAP since they were "C" (corporate) supported missions. NVWG activated 3 COVID-19 support missions which included 78 ground sorties, 4 air sorties, with 96 members participating.

2020 was also a year of severe wildfires across the western United States. Nevada was not spared, yet NVWG was able to provide additional assistance to ORWG when they had some AP missions that had been requested by FEMA and Oregon DEM. Another facet of the wildfires was the activation of an Area Command to support the ORWG operations.

#### **Homeland Security**

Nevada Wing continues to participate in USAF Green Flag operations throughout the year. In 2020 NVWG was involved in thirteen Green Flag West training missions. In addition, NVWG flew one low level route survey for the US Air Force in the Northern CA and NV area.

## Counterdrug

Nevada is mostly desert and semi-arid regions and receives the least amount of rainfall of any of the fifty states, hence, drug cultivation is usually found in mountainous areas within reach of a natural water source. However, NVWG does provide support to adjacent wings that do receive requests for counterdrug missions.

Shifting priorities within law enforcement resulted in no direct requests for NVWG CD support for the past number of years although requests for support from CAWG and AZWG have been made on occasion.

## **Chapter II            AEROSPACE EDUCATION**

### Internal Aerospace Education

The major focus of the Nevada Wing's Internal Aerospace Education program for 2020 was educating and helping the squadron AEOs get up to speed (half of all the squadrons had assigned new AEOs during the past two years) as well as assisting the squadrons in keeping the cadets engaged and interested during the 2020 COVID-19 pandemic shutdown. NVWG's AEPSM/Yeager completions continued to exceed national averages.

### External Aerospace Education

The Nevada Wing's External Aerospace Education efforts for 2020 continued to focus on building on the relationships with schools, teachers, youth groups, and other aviation minded organizations that had been previously developed, as well as forging new relationships with others that had not yet been realized.

## **Chapter III    CADET PROGRAMS**

### Cadet Programs

Nevada Wing continued to provide its cadets with a rich and rewarding experience. Cadets gained experience in leadership training, planning, time management, community service, aerospace education, and career exploration.

### Cadet Activities

Nevada Wing benefits from having a highly active Cadet Advisory Council (CAC), chaired by C/Capt Anastazia N. Rudolph until August, and by C/Capt Timothy Gelfer since then. During 2020, the CAC worked hard to keep cadets engaged through Discord, Zoom, and Teams activities.

#### Director of Operations

1. Nevada Wing flew 846 air sorties and conducted 130 ground sorties of all types during 2020. This significant reduction in sortie numbers from 2019 is a direct result of the groundings caused by the COVID-19 pandemic mitigation shutdown of activities.
2. Nevada wing conducted eleven searches during 2020 (eight for missing persons and three for activated ELTs). Seven FINDS and eight SAVES were awarded/credited by AFRCC.
3. Nevada Wing conducted one Low Level Route Survey for the US Air Force during 2020.
4. Nevada Wing conducted five Search and Rescue training missions during 2020.
5. Nevada Wing flew 79 sorties for Cadet Orientation flights during 2020 (34 for CAP cadets, 25 for AFROTC cadets, and 20 for AFJROTC cadets).

Nevada Wing members made approximately 1,045 face masks for distribution to Native Americans as well as medical workers in Las Vegas, Reno and Truckee. They were also provided to caregivers for the elderly.

3. Blood banks nation-wide saw a significant decrease in the donation of blood because of the pandemic – 80% of normal blood drive locations were shutdown. In response NHQ encouraged all members to donate blood as part of “Operation Pulse Lift”. Numerous NVWG members donated blood as part of the effort.

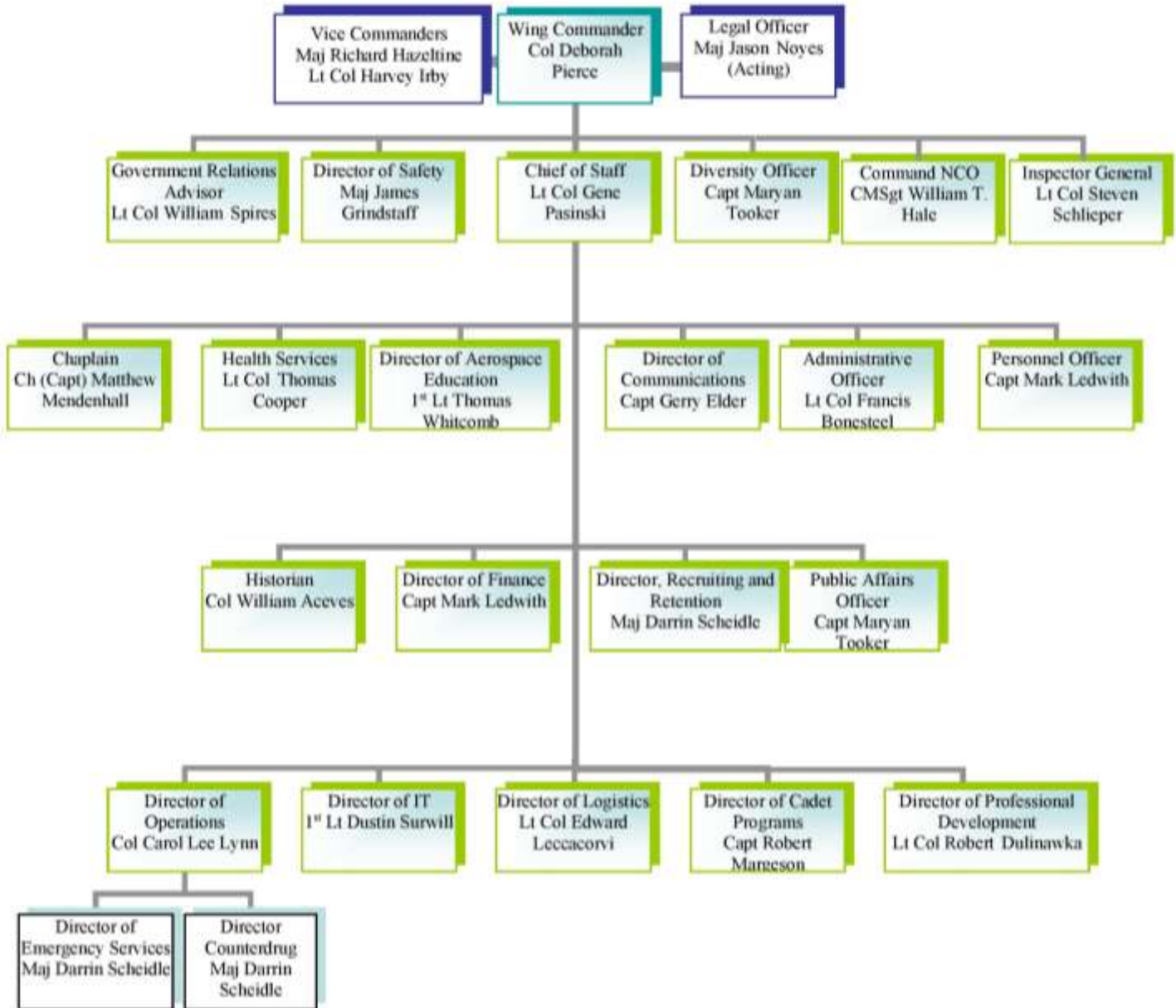
**COMPLETED STAFF ACTIONS CY 2020 –**

1. NVWG continued to move towards its goal of zero accidents, incidents, and mishaps. NVWG has reduced mishaps by 66% during the past 4 years. NVWG has been consistently reducing mishaps every year since FY2017. During FY2020 NVWG had 5 minor mishaps (only 1 mishap was a Bodily Injury - dehydration, hospitalization not required).
2. NVWG had zero accidents or incidents during FY2020.
3. Gave a presentation at the 2020 NVWG Conference: “Safety is Everywhere – How to Use It to Your Advantage” (18 members attended)
4. NVWG continued with its initiative of real safety education using "Real Time-contemporary” briefings. This is a break from the historical use of the “checkbox briefing” where members tend to recycle the same briefings over and over to fill the check box. The Nevada Wing initiative is to use contemporary safety events; especially those that occur outside of CAP to help prevent mishaps tomorrow. By combining contemporary knowledge with the check box knowledge, our members tend to retain more information while simultaneously reinforcing the old foundational safety points.
5. Mentored one unit Safety Officer, upgraded to Senior rating.

#### **Government Relations**

1. The Nevada legislature only meets every two years on odd-numbered years.

2. Maintained contact with the Nevada State Legislature.

### **Diversity**
