## SUMMARY NARRATIVE OF MAJOR ACTIVITIES

### Chapter I OPERATIONS

#### Search and Rescue

2018 EAA PRECAUTIONARY SAR:

IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE ANNUAL EAA AIRVENTURE IN OSHKOSH, WISCONSIN WING WORKED WITH THE AIR FORCE RESCUE COORDINATION CENTER TO OPEN AND MANAGE A PRECAUTIONARY SAR MISSION – WMIRS MISSION 18-M-0489. DURING THE 17 DAYS THAT THE MISSION WAS OPEN, GROUND TEAMS FROM WISCONSIN STAFFED THREE OPERATING LOCATIONS NEAR OSHKOSH – WITH THE NATIONAL BLUE BERET ACTIVITY STAFFING A FOURTH – TO LOCATE OVERDUE AIRCRAFT AND SILENCE ACCIDENTALLY ACTIVATED ELTS AMONG THE 10,000+ AIRCRAFT COMING IN AND OUT OF THE AIRVENTURE. A GRAND TOTAL OF 340 CAP PERSONNEL PARTICIPATED IN THIS MISSION, WHICH ALSO GENERATED 23 AIR SORTIES AND A GRAND TOTAL OF 63.2 FLIGHT HOURS.

#### WISCONSIN AIR COORDINATION GROUP

THE STATE OF WISCONSIN / WISCONSIN EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT FORMED THE WISCONSIN AIR COORDINATION GROUP IN LATE 2017 AS A SINGLE SOURCE FOR ANY AIR SUPPORT REQUESTS WITHIN THE STATE. WISCONSIN WING CAP JOINS THE WISCONSIN STATE PATROL, DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, WISCONSIN DRONE NETWORK AND WISCONSIN NATIONAL GUARD AS MEMBERS OF THIS WORKGROUP, WHICH RESPONDED TO AN AVERAGE OF ONE REQUEST FROM LOCAL RESPONDERS WITHIN THE STATE FOR AIR SUPPORT EVERY TWO TO THREE WEEKS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR.

#### Disaster Relief

##### PATRIOT NORTH 2018 EXERCISE

WISCONSIN WING PARTICIPATED IN THE NATIONAL GUARD BUREAU'S PATRIOT NORTH 2018 EXERCISE, A FOUR-DAY NATURAL DISASTER-BASED DOMOPS EXERCISE WITH PARTICIPATION FROM 51 DIFFERENT NATIONAL GUARD, FEDERAL, STATE, LOCAL AND NGO UNITS OR AGENCIES (HAILING FROM

25 DIFFERENT STATES) – A GRAND TOTAL OF 961 TOTAL RESPONDERS PARTICIPATING. 21 CAP MEMBERS FROM WISCONSIN WING, ILLINOIS WING AND GREAT LAKES REGION PARTICIPATED, FLYING 49 SORTIES AND 59.8 HOURS (ARMY AND AIR NATIONAL GUARD UNITS FLEW AN ADDITIONAL 33 HOURS).

#### WISCONSIN SUMMER/FALL 2018 FLOODS:

SEVERE STORMS, STRAIGHT-LINE WINDS AND FLOODING EVENTS STRUCK THE STATE OF WISCONSIN TWICE IN THE SUMMER AND FALL OF 2018 RESULTING IN WIDESPREAD DEVASTATION THAT ULTIMATELY LED TO MAJOR DISASTER DECLARATIONS (15 – 19 JUNE 2018 [DR-4383] & 17 AUGUST – 14 SEPTEMBER [DR-4402]). WISCONSIN WING RESPONDED BY CONDUCTING DAMAGE ASSESSMENT IMAGERY COLLECTION FOR WISCONSIN EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT, FLYING 13 SORTIES FOR A TOTAL OF 30.6 HOURS. ADDITIONALLY, WISCONSIN WING PERSONNEL STAFFED THE WISCONSIN STATE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER, SERVING AS THE STATE AIR OPERATIONS BRANCH DIRECTOR, MANAGING SORTIES FLOWN BY NOT ONLY WIWG CAP BUT ALSO THE WISCONSIN STATE PATROL, WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, THE WISCONSIN DRONE NETWORK AND THE WISCONSIN ARMY NATIONAL GUARD.

#### 2018 HURRICANE SEASON:

WISCONSIN WING PROVIDED REMOTE ASSISTANCE IN THE AFTERMATH OF HURRICANE FLORENCE TO SOUTHEAST REGION THROUGH CAP'S VIRTUAL INCIDENT COMMAND POST.

#### WIWG / WISCONSIN EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT MOU

Wisconsin Wing and Wisconsin Emergency Management concluded an almost two-year process of updating, reviewing and ultimately approving its joint Memorandum of Understanding, which was completed on 21 April 2018.

## **Chapter III CADET PROGRAMS**

### Cadet Programs

WISCONSIN WING'S CADET PROGRAM EXPERIENCED SIGNIFICANT GROWTH DURING 2018. THE WING ALSO SAW A SIGNIFICANT INCREASE IN ATTENDANCE AT ITS SUMMER ENCAMPMENT AND SAW THE LAUNCH OF THREE NEW ACTIVITIES DURING 2018. THE CADET PROGRAMS SECTION ALSO HAD A SUCCESSFUL COMPLIANCE INSPECTION.

OVERALL, THE WING'S CADET MEMBERSHIP GREW BY 13% DURING 2018. THIS GROWTH WAS LARGELY ACROSS ALL UNITS, THOUGH THE FOX CITIES COMPOSITE SQUADRON AND THE EAU CLAIRE COMPOSITE SQUADRON BOTH SAW SIGNIFICANTLY ABOVE-AVERAGE GROWTH. IN MAY, THE CADET CENSUS CROSSED THE 400-MEMBER THRESHOLD FOR THE FIRST TIME IN OVER 20 YEARS, AND WHILE IT DROPPED BELOW 400 MEMBERS FOR A PERIOD, IT ENDED THE YEAR AT 413.

### Cadet Activities

ON THE ACTIVITIES SIDE, THE CADET PROGRAM HELD THE LARGEST SUMMER ENCAMPMENT IN OVER A DECADE. MORE THAN 175 MEMBERS PARTICIPATED IN THE ENCAMPMENT, AND THE LARGEST FIRST YEAR SCHOOL IN OVER TEN YEARS WAS ENROLLED. THE WING ALSO STOOD UP TWO NEW PROGRAMS DURING 2018. FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE CHANGES WERE MADE TO THE NATIONAL CADET COMPETITION SYSTEM, WISCONSIN HAD MULTIPLE TEAMS INTERESTED IN COMPETING IN A WING-LEVEL COMPETITION. FOR THAT REASON, THE WING HOSTED A WING CADET COMPETITION FOR THE FIRST TIME IN SEVEN YEARS. MILWAUKEE COMPOSITE SQUADRON 5 WAS THE WINNER.

THE WING ALSO HAD RECORD ATTENDANCE AT ITS FALL NON-COMMISSIONED OFFICER SCHOOL AND DURING THE SAME WEEKEND STOOD UP A NEW AIRMAN TRAINING SCHOOL PROGRAM. THE AIRMAN TRAINING SCHOOL PROGRAM WAS PARTICULARLY NOTABLE AS IT WAS A PROJECT ENTIRELY BORNE OF THE EFFORTS OF PHASE IV CADETS. PHASE IV CADETS, SEEING AN UNMET TRAINING NEED, APPROACHED THE DIRECTOR OF CADET PROGRAMS AND ASKED TO RUN A SCHOOL FOR PHASE I CADETS. THE PHASE IV CADETS RECRUITED SENIOR STAFF, DESIGNED THE TRAINING PROGRAM, AND CARRIED OUT THE SCHOOL WITH ONLY MINIMAL LOGISTICAL SUPPORT FROM SENIORS.

THE THIRD NEW EVENT THAT THE WING STOOD UP WAS A CADET ADVISORY COUNCIL KICK-OFF MEETING DURING THE FIRST MONTH OF THE CAC TERM.



DURING THIS MEETING, CADETS FROM AROUND THE WING GATHERED AND CONDUCTED AN ANALYSIS AND VOTING PROCESS TO IDENTIFY THE TOP FIVE CONCERNS THEY HAD THAT THEY WANTED THE CAC TO WORK ON. THIS PROCESS CREATED A ROAD MAP FOR THE CAC AND PRODUCED BUY-IN BY THE CAC MEMBERS FOR TACKLING THE ISSUES THAT WERE IDENTIFIED. THE CAC ALSO DID GENERATE A REQUEST TO THE WING COMMANDER TO CREATE A POSITION TO FOCUS ON INCREASING DIVERSITY WITHIN THE WING'S MEMBERSHIP.

#### Drug Demand Reduction

There were no separate Drug Demand Reduction events or goals as the publication of CAPR 60-1 eliminated DDR as a standalone program and reporting area.

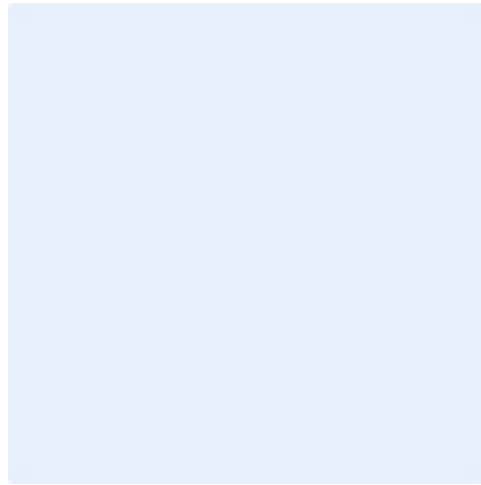

1. DURING 2018 THE PUBLIC AFFAIRS TEAM CONTINUED TO FOCUS ON INCREASING OUR SOCIAL MEDIA FOLLOWING THROUGH THE USE OF FACEBOOK, TWITTER, AND INSTAGRAM. THE WISCONSIN WING FACEBOOK PAGE CONTINUES TO GROW OUR PAGE LIKES AND FOLLOWERS AT A STEADY PACE. WE HAD AN 8% INCREASE IN FOLLOWERS FROM 2018 (STARTING AT 2,140 AND ENDING 2018 AT 2,307). THIS INCREASE IN FOLLOWERS AND SOCIAL MEDIA PARTICIPATION HAS ENABLED THE WING TO SHARE VITAL INFORMATION TO OUR MEMBERS AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC.
2. THE PUBLIC AFFAIRS TEAM HOSTED A CADET AND OFFICER TRAINING EVENT AT THE 2018 WISCONSIN WING CONFERENCE. BOTH CLASSES FOCUSED ON THE IMPORTANCE OF PROPER SOCIAL MEDIA POSTS; WITH THE CADET CLASS SHARING THE EMPHASIS FOR SQUADRONS TO EMPLOY CADET PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICERS.

1. MAJ. NICK RUSHIZKY TOOK THE POSITION IN OCTOBER 2018. THE SITUATION FOR ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION AT THAT POINT WAS A BIT OUT OF DATE. THE WING USED EXACTLY ONE GROUP MAILING

LIST, TO WHICH MAYBE 25% OF THE MEMBERS AT MOST SUBSCRIBED, AND SINCE THE MAILING LIST HASN'T BEEN UPDATED, A FAIR NUMBER OF ADDRESSES IN THAT LIST WERE FOR PEOPLE WHO HAVEN'T BEEN MEMBERS FOR SOME TIME - OR EVEN FORMER MEMBERS (AS IN MEMBERS WHO'VE PASSED). THE DECISION WAS MADE TO IMPLEMENT MICROSOFT'S OFFICE 365, WHICH CAN COMBINE FILE SHARING, EMAIL, GROUP CHATS, VIDEO CONFERENCING, AND CALENDARING, ALONG WITH OTHER TOOLS. AS OF FEBRUARY 2019, THE SYSTEM IS IN BETA TESTING FOR THE WING AND MORE MEMBERS ARE BEING ASKED TO TEST THE SYSTEM. THE CURRENT PLAN IS THAT BEFORE THE WING CONFERENCE IN MAY, ALL MEMBERS OF THE WING WILL HAVE ACCESS AND THE CURRENT MAIL USERS OF THE WIWG.CAP.GOV DOMAIN (ONLY ABOUT 150 PEOPLE) WILL BE BROUGHT INTO THE 365 SYSTEM, WITH THE REST OF THE MEMBERS USING THE WICAP.US DOMAIN FOR THEIR EMAIL ADDRESSES. NUMEROUS MAILING LISTS ARE BEING PLANNED AND THE PROJECT IS PROCEEDING ON SCHEDULE.

THE NATURE OF OUR DUTIES IS SUCH THAT WE DO NOT KEEP STATISTICS NORMALLY OF WHAT IS DONE. I WOULD NOTE THAT ANY DISCIPLINARY ACTION OR OTHER ACTIONS WITH IN WHICH A REPORT OF INVESTIGATION WOULD BE REQUIRED CAN BE VERIFIED THROUGH THE WING INSPECTOR GENERAL, WHO PREPARES THOSE REPORTS. THEREFORE, I REALLY DO NOT HAVE ANY SPECIFICS WITH WHICH TO MAKE A REPORT.
